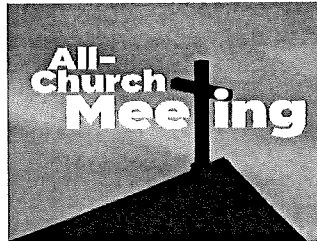

ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING
JANUARY 21, 2024

The annual Congregational Meeting of the Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd was called to order by Chairperson, Sue Buerger at 9:54 a.m. on January 21, 2024. Pastor Chris Buresh opened with a prayer. Attendance was taken and determined to be enough for a quorum and legal meeting. The minutes from January 2023 meeting were distributed to everyone and a motion was made by Shawn Erickson to accept with Keith Gansel 2nd.

Pastoral Report: Pastor Buresh reviewed membership changes noting that there was membership growth. Giving has decreased but all operating expenses were able to be paid with the receipts. There was more interest accrued than there were withdrawals from the enrichment fund. The church is using a new cloud-based database which will streamline giving reports to members. There is a trip being planned to the Holy Land. New giving from the Missions Committee as well as the Trustees will report on repairs and maintenance including a new roof as the building is over 20 years old. Council changes are mentioned as well as other staffing changes including Cindy Gansel is retiring. Work is being done to find replacements as needed. Thank you to all who have helped throughout the year.

Associate Pastor Report: Pastor Bell stated that the church was able to bring back some traditional Good Shepherd things such as the Jr. High lock-in, Mission Trip and the desert auction. Good to bring people together. While it's great to do traditional things being open to new and changes is important. The youth need the church to be current in 2023 to keep things fresh. Thank you for letting him to continue to be the associate pastor and the support of the youth here at Good Shepherd.

Director of Children's Ministry: Lori Puttkammer reported that church provided the Sunday school children with many creative ways to learn about God and how he provides us with all we need and the children reflect those efforts. The Children's Ministry continued to grow, and new ideas were tried out to great success. New "break out" sessions as well as having the second year of having a Sunday school supplies coordinator along with the Puppet Ministry the children have many ways to share in His Word each week. The revitalized church nursery offered loving caregiving in the 11:00 service to children under 2. The larger events such as the

Eater Eggstravaganza, VBS and Trunk or Treat continued to show growth. Volunteers are needed to continue the momentum.

Director of Music: Aaron Basch thanked everyone for their support this year. The choirs resumed full schedules. Thank you to the members and the music staff changes were discussed. Thank you to Donna and Cindy. Time to join, please consider it.

Finance Committee: Paul Behrman reported on the Bernstein Enrichment Account and the Mission Endowment Account. He mentioned that stocks can be given as an offering and there would not be any capital gains.

Youth & Education Committee: Edith Schmitt reported that it was a very busy year offering many opportunities for fellowship and fun for members of all ages. Our programs, Bible study groups and family activities continue to grow and thrive. Thanks to the Pastors and Lori for their guidance and devotion and to the volunteers. Thank you also to the congregation for continued participation, support and love.

Congregational Activities: Lauren Kirkner reported that the church year kicked off with another great Rally Day. They are preparing for Ash Wednesday luncheon and an invitation to all was offered. Thanks to all of the volunteers and to all of the congregation that helped and attended throughout the year to share in friendship and love. Please get involved and help if you are able.

Deacons: Mike Aspen reported the Board of Deacons serves the congregation by supporting our worship practices and congregational needs and meet monthly with Pastors and Lori. Recording of the offerings was switched to a new system of entering and tracking. The system makes it more efficient to enter and retrieve the information. It is more efficient and timelier. The Deacons hosted a Lenten dinner and picnics and of course the Deacon's coffees. Please join for future events.

Church and Community: Melinda Moore reported the Church and Community Committee continued its work to help Good Shepherd become a bigger part of the community and promote awareness of events happening at the church like VBS and Trunk or Treat and the Christmas concert. Good Shepherd was also a polling place for elections. Participation in the Palos Heights Holiday Parade was lots of fun. Two community blood drives were hosted in 2023. Thank you to everyone who helped with the events that took place last year.

Trustees: Pastor Buresh: Matt Behrman reported the roof is 95% completed. There is more roof work to be done in 2024. The air handler in the life center was replaced. Remodeling in the parsonage bathroom was also completed last year. Thank you for all your generosity as with the age of the church there will be more repairs on the horizon.

Missions and Charities: Shawn Erickson reported that the Missions Committee was thankful for the generosity, and it makes the committee fun to be a part of. More than \$180,000 was distributed. Council initiated a new program called the Giving Tree. 10-year goal of setting aside \$50,000 a year from the enrichment fund to make a difference. Please see the handout for more information.

Stewardship: Joe Perry reported that the Stewards Committee counts the money that you donate so generously. You keep donating and they'll keep counting.

2024 Budget: Bill Markel presented the 2023 budget to the Congregation to approve. The motion to approve and seconded were accepted. Approve: Lenore Meyer and Lauren Kirkner 2nd.

Nomination of Church Officers: April Strand presented the nominations for the 2024 church officers. A motion was made by Shawn Erickson and seconded by Bonnie Sweeney to accept these nominations.

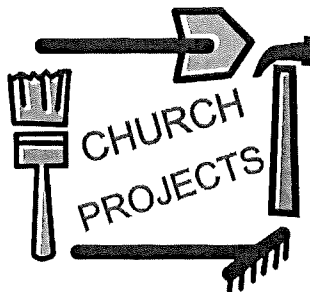

TRUSTEE REPORT

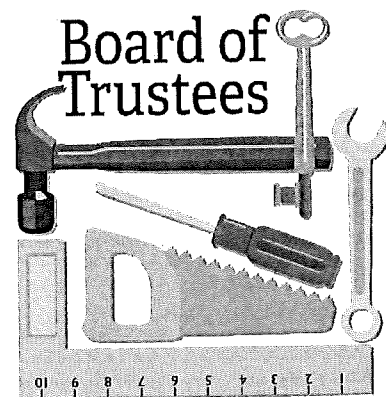

Finally, I would like to thank all those who helped when called and thank the Church Council for approving the outlay of money to continue to make capital improvements to the Church.

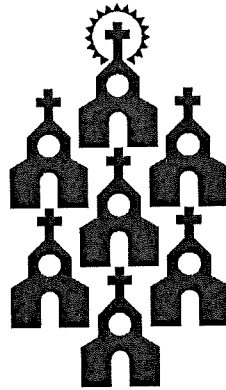

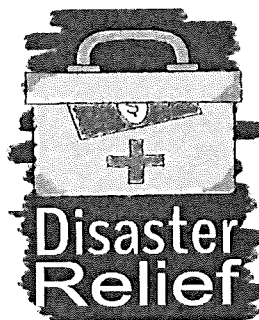

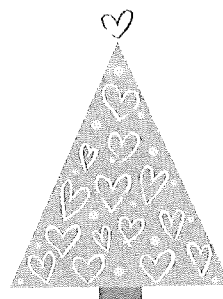

This year, Good Shepherd distributed in missions the equivalent of 35% of our operational budget. Included in our support was the awarding of the annual contribution for a capital improvement project to Lutheran Outdoor Ministries which used it to repair pathways and concrete patios to provide safe and accessible access through out their property.

Good Shepherd also continued the Giving Tree Gift Program, inspired by supporting our missions partners as we simultaneously invest in our physical facilities. The 2025 recipients of this grant were: Northside Housing to support their new 70 bed homeless shelter; The Second Story Foundation with \$10,000 to support their work providing care and housing for men recovering from substance abuse; South Suburban Joy Emporium with \$24,000 to rent space at a local Lutheran church and continue to expand their work in Midlothian; and a project partnering with Refugee One for \$6,000 to help provide housing and immediate needs for refugees in the Chicagoland area.

These financial contributions are in addition to the multitude of ways you have already been part of sharing the mission of Christ. These include the Easter Blessing Bags for the Palos Food Pantry, constructing a house during the Big Build, collecting a box-truck full of coats and blankets for the clients of All Things Through Christ Ministries, providing 176 foster children with Christmas presents, cooking monthly meals for the clients of Morningstar Mission and countless other ways of reaching out and supporting God’s work in our greater community.

The Mission Committee would like to thank the entire congregation for their generosity and trust as we together strive to make a meaningful impact in our world through, touching it with ongoing expressions of God’s love and hope.
